CONFERENCE BACKGROUND & AIM

The aspiration of His Highness Sheikh Tamim Bin Hamad Al Thani, Emir of the State of Qatar, is delivered through Qatar's National Vision 2030. The vision recognizes the importance of quality health services including mental health. Driven by Qatar's National Vision 2030, The Mental Health Friends Association (Weyak) in collaboration with The Ministry of Public Health (MOPH) decided to organize a conference on Confidentiality and Information Sharing with an intention to find a model that treasures the social and cultural aspects of the population in Qatar.

Central to confidentiality and information sharing is the influence of any disclosure of information on the therapeutic relationship between patients and clinicians. In practice, circumstances arise when there a need to share information across institutional and professional boundaries, in order to ensure effective coordination and integration of services. One of the most important duties of health institutions in general, and mental health ones in particular, is keeping confidentiality and protecting the information that they collect, generate, hold and handle. It is equally important for those institutions to create and appropriately implement information sharing methods both internally and with other health sectors through transparent guidelines and policies; in a manner that is consistent with the laws of the land, professional guidelines and ethical codes of practice.

In Qatar, the health economy has been characterized by rapid growth and diversification. Reflecting the state efforts to accomplish its 2030 National Vision. Today Qatar has mental health institutions in all health sectors, public, private and the independent sector. However, there is a need to find out a suitable model for maintaining confidentiality and sharing information that allow these sectors to work effectively while respecting relevant sociocultural parameters. The latter is significant in improving the uptake of the mental health services.

Weyak and the MOPH recognise the significance of this challenge and the need to provide a platform for public and professional debate on confidentiality and information sharing; with the patients, families, advocates, human right activists and professional from diverse backgrounds: health, sociology, ethics and law.
